I want to call out a few key things that have taken place in July. If you haven't stopped by the Centennial Community Garden, David Shinners and other volunteers are moving right along in improving that space and you can see changes weekly. (And I think it's a fantastic addition to the LIC.)

At the marina, the big news is we have a permit to proceed with providing Wave Broadband, so we expect to see that project happening soon with a massive upgrade in Internet connectivity – and a huge plus for visiting boaters – soon. To that end, we don't know when the construction will begin, but when it does, we'll encourage patience since a portion of the parking lot will be blocked off: a 135' trench will need to be dug down the dumpster side.








Finally, The Longbranch Foundation has a new president, Michele Gorman. Welcome, Michele – and excited to see what's ahead for the TLF.

Why do we have The Longbranch Foundation?

Our mission: To inspire collaboration and generosity in order to promote educational opportunities, to maintain the area's history and to improve the natural environment. As an affiliate of the LIC, the Foundation shares the goal of working to improve our community. The Foundation is chartered to support the LIC historic building and grounds; the Environment, particularly the marine environment around the LIC Marina as well as public safety issues at the Marina; Public school education activities; and like-minded Community organizations. The Foundation is managed by a Board of Directors, all volunteers, and relies on the LIC to recruit volunteers for fundraising and educational support programs.

The Foundation was originally incorporated in 2016 as a tax-exempt 501(c)(3) charitable organization to give donors the benefit of tax laws and to qualify for grants only available to charitable organizations. The LIC is a tax-exempt 501(c)(4) social welfare organization. The Foundation has since picked up and expanded the support to education started by the LIC. The scholarship program, started by the LIC, included money given to Evergreen Elementary School to support its 5th grade environmental camp experience, together with donations of clothes, hygiene supplies, etc. The LIC program also included awarding scholarships to Peninsula High School seniors who attended Evergreen Elementary to support their pursuit of higher education. The Foundation has increased its support to Evergreen Elementary, is establishing a program for the Key Peninsula Middle School, and has added recurring scholarships to the higher education Scholarship program.



The LIC Cookbook Art & More

In 2013 a team of LIC volunteers gathered and produced a cookbook containing 385 recipes collected from the LIC membership and beyond, artwork contributed by Melissa Haumerson, and stories written by Connie Hildahl and Karen Johnson. Peg Bingham, Barbara Van Bogart, Barbara Doat, Sharon Gearhart and Barb Floyd also contributed to this effort. There were 500 cookbooks sold as well as cards and prints produced from the artwork. The profit from these sales benefited the LIC Kitchen and was used in part to purchase a badly needed new refrigerator.

The Foundation will be co-hosting with the LIC a booth at the TWAA Art Walk on August 4. We will have Cookbook Art Cards and Prints for sale. The Artwork from the Cookbook is the same as the ten watercolor prints that are hanging in the meeting room at the LIC. We are thinking of doing a reprint of the book, the publisher keeps our book on file for ten years, so we need to do this now if ever. We will need to do a survey to see if this is of interest to people and worth the investment. We are also wondering if there is interest in creating a supplement containing new recipes from some of our new members.

We will need someone to coordinate this effort to make it happen. If you have any interest, please let me know.

BOARD REPORTS

Secretary: Sheryl Low requested that the minutes of last month's membership meeting be approved as written and submitted. MSP

Treasurer: Jim Hettinger presented the financials for the month of June. We are above budget this month by \$2,000.

Buildings and Grounds:

LIC General Meeting July 21, 2021

Marina Chair: Rick Harrison presented the Marina Advisory Committee made up of Randy Carr, Denny Prichard, Kelly Hettinger, Katie Harrison, Brett Allen and Jim Craig. We have one kayak spot open for rental. Also we will be hosting Thirsty Thursdays again starting at 4 PM at the Marina. A big Thank You to the following people for volunteering at the Marina: Tom Tallman for ice, Andy Gano for electrical with Tim Enders, Harry Rydell, for repair of the bull rail, Merian Henrich for painting of bull rails, Vickie Shelton for power washing the wharf, Claude Lee for propane and grills and Dennis Westphal for deck screws.



Pumpout Station Update: Brett Allen reported that the Dive Study completed by Soundview Consultants, and the majority of the land under the marina is clear of vegetation which is good for the proposed Marina Expansion. We are now going through the process for approval of the pumpout station at the state level by the Department of Ecology. This is a 30day process. Once we get their approval we can seek our first permit before final design. This will be brought before the Marina Advisory Board for approval and coordination.



Preservation Grant Update: Marsha Kremen reported on the Preservation Project. The architects have been out here surveying the structure in order to prepare an as-built which will begin the design process for the new roof. This project will update the roof with insulation and preserve the historical provenance. The architects are working with a company that has laser technology to map the building. Bart Wolfe is shepherding this project through the process.

THE LONGBRANCH FOUNDATION:

The Quilt for Evergreen school was laid out for all to view. It commemorates the donation of the property for the first school and the continued support of Evergreen Elementary through the years. This quilt will be presented to the new Evergreen elementary when it's finished, to hang in the new school building.


