## President's Message

The 1<sup>st</sup> of August is almost here, and the summer once again seems to be zipping by too fast. Our newest directors had their Board orientation, and are at work planning our events and caring for our building & grounds – we are most fortunate to have Bob & Barb Green and Bob Perry, respectively, chairing these important functions.

We previously reported, the LIC applied for a Pierce County Preservation Grant, covering complete repair/renovation of the bank of five large windows on the west side of the building at a total project cost of approximately \$22,800. Francie Carr attended the July 17<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Preservation Board and reports our project was approved for funding by that Board. The Pierce County Council will act on all Grant applications, when it goes through its budget deliberations this fall, and if sufficient funding is provided, our project will receive 50% funding in 2019.

Our marina upgrade project remains in the permitting stage and the process will take a little more time. We made some progress on the State level, by coming to an agreement with the Department of Natural Resources, regarding a sticking point for them. The issue involved, whether the new floats would rest on the Filucy Bay floor at an extreme low tide (-4.5MLLW), and if so, they wanted stops incorporated into the construction of the floats at a cost of several thousands of dollars. Our contractor's position on this is that it is highly unlikely this could ever happen, so our compromise was to agree to retrofit the floats in the unlikely event it does occur. On the federal front, the Corps. of Engineers is in the process of approving our permits; however, we remain in a waiting pattern with National Marine Fisheries (NOAA).

- 3) Finally, it saddens me and many other LIC members to say "Goodbye for now!" to Gayle and Shirley Brewer, as they set out for a new life in Yakima, WA in early August. Gayle recruited me to the board and I'll be forever grateful for his excellent leadership. He was the guiding force behind the LIC's first ever Long Range Strategic Plan, which we will follow closely through to the LIC's 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of legal existence in 2021. Gayle was also instrumental in crafting the early payment program for the wharf promissory notes, and was very much at the heart of the last two Pierce County Preservation Grants for the building, among a host of other things. Shirley assisted with the selection of scholarship recipients, and was a dedicated leader with the landscaping around the LIC clubhouse and at a number of events, including the bake sale at the bi-annual Super Sale. They will be very much missed by me and this entire organization, and we wish them a long life of health and happiness.

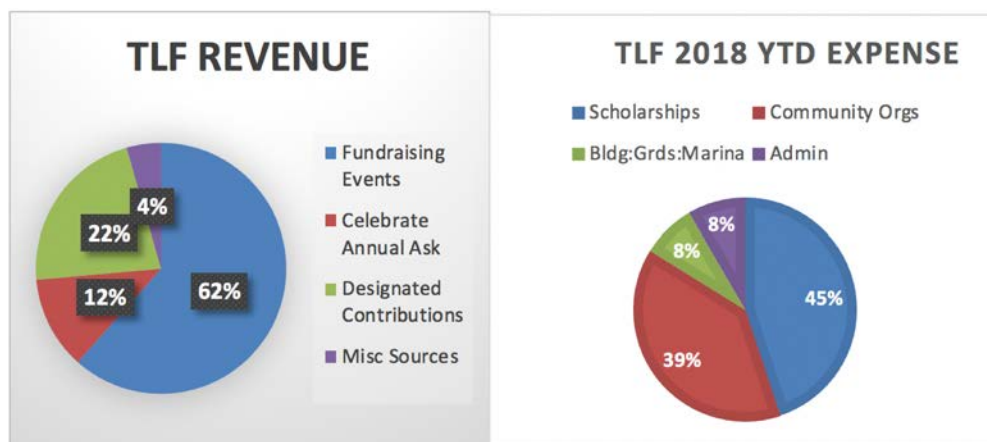

## LIC General Meeting July 18, 2018



Marsha Kremen, vice-president, called the meeting to order at 7 p.m.

New members, Linda and John Schell, were welcomed, as was Robin Gould's granddaughter, Dare.

Robin introduced the night's guest speakers, Lieutenant Travis McNealy and Petty Officer3 Alastair Brockmeyer, from the U.S. Coast Guard. The following are excerpts from their presentation.

The Coast Guard's mission is to provide aids to navigation in all the waters from Canada to just south of California - and including the Columbia River.

The buoy outside of Filucy Bay was installed in 2006 and the hull replaced in 2013. Its purpose is to enable Coast Guard vessels to moor in the area when on patrol or on search and rescue operations. The buoy, designed by the U.S. Navy, has 160 feet of chain and two sinkers made of concrete [one weighing 18,000 pounds and the other 850 pounds]. The buoy is capable of holding an eighty-seven foot patrol boat in forty knot winds.

The Coast Guard conducts random "boardings" on all size vessels to make certain that all boats have the proper and necessary safety gear. The importance of having and wearing life jackets was stressed.

The Coast Guard was incorporated as part of the Department of Homeland Security after 2001, with the goal of ensuring our Nation's

maritime safety, security and stewardship.

Robin presented our speakers with a thank you gift of a hat for each.

### OFFICER REPORTS

Secretary: The members were asked to approve the minutes of the June 20th general meeting, as written and submitted. MSP.

Treasurer: The Profit and Loss Budget Performance and Summary Balance Sheet show that the financial activity through June was in line with the budget.

President: Clark Van Bogart sent a big thank you to all who helped decorate the float for the Home 4th of July parade. The December general membership meeting will be held December 12th.

Trustee at Large: Francie Carr reported that the grant application, for the repair and restoration of the west bank of the windows of the LIC building, has been approved by the Pierce County Landmark and Building Preservation Commission.

### COMMITTEE REPORTS

Membership: Nancy Carr announced that membership forms are available at the membership desk.

Events: Barb Green requested volunteer help for the Labor Day Dance. She has sign-up sheets at her table.

Building and Grounds: Bob Perry encouraged members to join the committee. Jim Sobieck is building a new wooden fence around the dumpster area and a new gate close to the LIC building.

Peg Bingham announced the new class schedule for CPR classes. The class will be held at the Key Center Fire Station on

September 29th from 9 to 12 o'clock, at a cost of \$35. A Stop the Bleed class will follow, from 12 to 1 o'clock.

### THE LONGBRANCH FOUNDATION

President Barb Floyd reported that the new Longbranch sign application has been filed and the permit approved.

Over \$6,000 in grants have been awarded to community organizations, including, most recently, a \$1,000 grant to the Farm Tour. These grants have been made possible by your generous donations. You can be proud that The Foundation is doing well, thanks to your support.
