President's Message

<u>Marina Assessment</u>. Our Marina Committee has been proactive in laying the groundwork for securing a renewal of our lease with the DNR when our current lease expires in early 2017. As part of that preparation we need an objective, professional engineering assessment of the marina's current condition on which to base planning for necessary repairs and/or replacement. At the July membership meeting, the proposal to go forward with this was approved. We have selected Echelon Engineering, a highly regarded firm to do the work this summer or fall.

<u>Long Range Planning</u>. Still a work in progress but moving forward with the assistance of a professional facilitator. We have an open timeline for completing our plan, but we do hope to wrap up by year's end and will report what we have to the membership when it is ready to share.

<u>Clubhouse</u>. We need to deal with our sticky, poorly functioning side doors (both north and south) in order to comply with emergency exit requirements as pointed out by the Fire Marshall at a recent inspection. And we are nearing completion of the flag pole replacement project, thanks to Denny Prichard, Doug Lewis and Sharon Gearhart. By the time you read this, both of these projects should be complete.

<u>More Clubhouse</u>. The professional historical assessment of our clubhouse is nearing completion, and we may have the written report by the end of August. Dr. Carolyn Swope, who is leading the assessment, has agreed to present our November membership meeting program on "History of the LIC Clubhouse".

<u>LIC General Meeting</u> 07/16/14 @ LIC lobby called to order 7:30 PM after a very informative Washington Boater Safety Program. Thank you to Denny Prichard for arranging for this speaker to come to our meeting.

Dockmaster: (Lynn Carr) reported that the Marina has been busy this last month, and cookbooks continue to sell at the dock.

Rental Agent : (Kim Chaney) reported that the clubhouse was booked for a wedding and a memorial service.

<u>Secretary:</u> (Judy Riggs) A letter of appreciation from the Vaughn Middle School teacher who had brought the school chorus to sing at the Down Key Festival was read, thanking the LIC for the \$200 donation to their music program. It was then MSP to accept the LIC June General Meeting minutes.

<u>Treasurer</u>: (Jim Hettinger) reports that in June, funds from the P&L were transferred to equity accounts to reserve money for scholarship fund donations and towards the marina and building improvement capital funds. Additionally, a building depreciation expense was entered for the month. We are currently solvent with checking and saving accounts. (You can contact Jim for precise account balances.)

Membership: (Eloise Colbert) reports four new memberships, making 173 in total.

<u>Events:</u> (Delia McGinnis) Bebop Co-op is lined up for Sat. July 26. She is looking for a bartender and few more volunteers for set up. The Events Committee met a week late this month due to the 4th of July holiday. Next month the meeting will be on the normal schedule.

<u>Marina:</u> (Denny Prichard) The Marina Committee has sent a letter to members who own a boathouse at the LIC Marina. There will be required upgrades to the boathouses in order to meet current DNR regulations for the 2017 Longbranch Marina lease renewal.

<u>Building and Grounds</u>: (Sharon Gearhart) reports that a group of members have each volunteered to adopt and maintain a portion of the grounds and or gardens around the clubhouse. She is still looking for someone to take on one last part of the yard. She also wanted to remind everyone to be diligent about taking the trash out of the building to discourage mice visiting the building. She also suggested not storing anything in the outside shed that the mice could use for nesting. Finishing the Trail is one of the first work party projects to be scheduled. Also, thanks to Tim Heitzman and Bill Lloyd for replacing the bulbs on the stage lights.

Down Key fund raising grant money was distributed to Evergreen Elementary School for outdoor education camp. The LIC Board will inform Evergreen annually how much of the donation is to be used. And money was also given to the Gig Harbor Canoe and Kayak racing team to put towards a needed new trailer. The LIC Historic Structural Survey report is expected to be done within the next 3 weeks.

Progress on the setting the flag pole is going well with a small group of member volunteers pitching in. When ready, LIC will schedule Pen Light to come out and set the pole.


I want to thank everyone for giving me the opportunity to be the Events Chair. I'm very excited about the challenge and am looking forward to working with all of you.
